Any competitions other than those covered in the Rules for Driving Events must be approved by the FEI before they may be added to the schedule

Schedules for CAI-A4,2,1/CAIP-A4,2,1/CAI-B4,2,1/CAIP-B4,2,1 and Championships are approved by the FEI.

Schedules for these events must be sent to the FEI Secretariat for approval by the NF concerned, at least 16 weeks before the event is due to take place.

Definite schedules must be sent to the FEI Secretariat by the NFs concerned at least 4 weeks before the event takes place.

Final approval of the draft schedule by the FEI, in accordance with Art. 115.1, denotes only that the contents conform to the FEI Statutes, General Regulations and Rules. By no means does this entail implicit acceptance of any liability by the FEI for any damages to third parties caused by the Organising Committee and its officials, riders, drivers, owners, and their horses.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

TEAMS

Each Nation may enter 6 drivers with 6 horses per driving carriage on the nominated entry list. However 3 drivers, each with 3 horses can be entered on the definite entry list and are allowed to participate at the event. If a Nation can only enter 2 drivers, they will be considered as a team.

INDIVIDUAL DRIVERS

A Nation unable to send a team may enter on the nominated entry list a driver with a maximum of 6 horses of which only 3 will participate at the event and placed on the definite entry list.

Only **after** all the teams have been allocated will the additional individual drivers be considered by the OC (Art. 918.3 rev)

AGES OF DRIVERS AND GROOMS

Drivers born before 1989 and grooms born before 1993 are authorized to participate in the event.

HORSES

Horse must be at least 6 years old (Art. 911). NF's may enter 6 horses per competitor on nominated entry list but only 3 will participate in the competition and be listed on the definite entry list.

FACILITIES OFFERED (Art. 132, 133, 933)

A) Competitors, Chefs d'Equipe, Team Veterinarians, Trainers, Grooms

1. Accommodation

For each Nation a camping-area will be reserved on the showground big enough to house trucks, motor homes, caravans, tents and carriages for Competitors, Chefs d'Equipe, Team Veterinarian and accredited grooms and trainers.

The number of persons and vehicles/tents - including the size - are to be advised to the OC with Nominated Entries.

This area will be provided by the OC from Monday 27th August 09:00 am until Monday 3rd September 12:00 p.m. (noon)

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female persons, with



hot and cold water as well as electricity (~230V) will be provided by the OC. No private electricity generators are allowed on the competition site. There will be no water hookup for horse trailers or campers. Sufficient water, in designated areas, will be provided for washing horses and carriages.

All dogs must be kept on the lead.

Due to the traffic problems, which may appear, you will be allowed to leave the camping area on Sunday, September 2nd only from 6 pm.

B) Horses

1. Transport expenses

The OC will not provide compensation for transport expenses.

For all Non-EC horses a carnet A.T.A. has to be presented at the border.

2. Stabling Arrangements

Three horses per driver are accepted. They will be housed free of charge in individual boxes (3 x 3 m). One extra box will be provided per nation. Reservations for additional boxes (EURO 100/box) have to be made with the Nominated Entries.

Boxes which are reserved but are not used during the event will be charged at EURO 100 each to the Nations concerned. Competitors are not permitted to erect their own loose-boxes.

Stables will be provided from Monday 27th August 09:00 am until Monday 3rd September 12:00 p.m. (noon).

The OC will provide the first bedding. Type of bedding (straw or shavings) must be written in the Nominated Entries. Shavings (EURO 18 / bale), hay (EURO 3 / bale) and straw (EURO 2 / bale) can be purchased on site. All other types of feed have to be supplied by competitors.



C) WELCOME

In order to facilitate the competitors arrival, the date and the approximate arrival time of drivers and horses are to be advised with the Definite Entries.

A questionnaire will be supplied to NFs to provide all the information needed by the OC to prepare for the arrival of competitors with Definite Entries.
